

PRINCE GEORGE

Nestled at the confluence of the Fraser and Nechako Rivers, Prince George is the largest urban center in northern British Columbia.

Known for its still-thriving forestry industry, it plays a key role as a strategic crossroads between the West Coast and the Rockies.

It serves as a convenient and enjoyable stopover for travelers journeying between Smithers and Jasper. While often seen as a transit city, Prince George offers hidden gems that make for a well-deserved break.

Upon arrival, don't miss the chance to greet Mr. PG, an impressive wooden-man statue standing at the city's entrance—a nod to its rich forestry heritage.

WHAT TO DO

LHEIDLİ T'ENNEH MEMORIAL PARK (FORT GEORGE PARK)

Located in the heart of downtown, this large park is perfect for a picnic and a stroll along the water. It is also home to The Exploration Place Museum, which showcases the region's history and culture.

Families looking to stretch their legs after a long day on the road will appreciate a stop at Lheidli T'enneh Memorial Park (formerly known as Fort George Park), named in honor of the local First Nations.

NEARBY

FORT ST. JAMES NATIONAL HISTORIC SITE ★

Located about 1 hour and 45 minutes away, this exceptional site immerses visitors in the history of the fur trade in British Columbia. Explore restored buildings, traditional craft demonstrations, and the daily life of settlers and First Nations in the 19th century.

ANCIENT FOREST TRAIL (CHUN T'OH WHUDUJUT) ★★

Just an hour's drive east of Prince George, this remarkable site is home to a rare inland temperate rainforest with towering, ancient cedar trees. A boardwalk trail provides easy access for exploration and appreciation of this unique ecosystem.
